The community will benefit by having enhanced local access to healthy, affordable food. This will be achieved by:

- Establishing Community
 Pantries, supplied with food from supermarket and other surpluses that would otherwise go to waste, e.g. FareShare Cymru,
 FareShare Go, local supermarkets, farmers, etc.
- Selling food affordably at £5 per bag, (worth 3pprox.. £20) i.e. sales will cover costs such as delivery/pick up, venue costs, purchases of paper bags and other equipment etc. to form a sustainable system.
- Delivery of bags of food to people who cannot travel to the Community Pantry, e.g. elderly, housebound, those with poor access to transport, carers.
- The instigation and support of local growing projects to supply Community Pantries, e.g. production of herbs, fruit and vegetables. Encourage local growers to donate surpluses to their local pantry.

- Working with partners (e.g. Public Health Wales, NHS Wales, Employability, RSLs) to develop a programme of food based activities delivered locally.
- Regular production and distribution of printed resources such as recipes. (With ingredients where possible)
- Encouraging/enabling pantry

- Encouraging pantry clients to try unfamiliar foods and suggest appropriate recipes.

- Engaging local partners to provide wellbeing activities in Community Pantry locations, e.g. carers support groups, exercise groups such as walking, keep fit and olympage, Mums & Toddlers, craft groups, cuppa with a copper, employment
